Leases at Last

At long last, the new leases for Gordon Road and Nethercourt Avenue Allotments have been agreed, signed and sealed between The Finchley Horticultural Society and London Borough of Barnet. The documents are dated from 1st October 2012 for a period of 38 years - renewal will be up in 2050!

Disappointingly we have not yet received the lease for Brent Way Allotments. We very much hope to receive this in September and so complete the transfer of our leased land to self-management.

A new Tenants Agreement for ploholders, based on the new lease, has been drawn up and incorporated within a revised Handbook for Ploholders.

This is a great opportunity for the Society to forge a positive and progressive future, managing our allotments to the best of our abilities. However, this will not be possible without the full co-operation and help of every ploholder. We will be expecting you all to put in an extra bit of work for our sites - not just your plot. Please respond positively to the challenges which lie ahead. There are many jobs to be done - Barnet Council are no longer there to do any work on our behalf.

Watch Out for Blight

Blight is a serious disease which can destroy a tomato or potato crop very quickly, in as little as 10 days. The fungus which causes blight goes under the name *Phytophthora*. It is spread by either wind or rain in temperatures above 10°C (50°F). It is especially problematic in late summer during wet weather in the UK and may occur as early as June in the south. Experts say that more and more outbreaks of blight are originating from allotments and gardens.

We are being asked to be on the look-out for blight this summer to control its widespread infection. The first signs are dark brown markings on the edges of leaves. Brown lesions may develop on the stems. Leaves then curl and the plant wilts. If allowed to spread unchecked, it will reach potato tubers. They will be reddish-brown decay below the skin, firm at first but soon developing into a soft rot. Infected tubers will rot in store. Symptoms on tomato leaves and stems are similar to those on potatoes. Brown patches may appear on green fruit and mature fruit will, heartbreakingly, decay rapidly.

Fight the Blight

- If blight strikes, cut out affected leaves and stems immediately. If more than 10% is affected cut off and remove all foliage. Wait 2-3 weeks before digging up the potato crop. Blight affected *foliage* can be composted - well buried in an active heap. Never compost blight infected *tubers* - put these in your personal green wheelie bin.
- Early-harvested potatoes are more likely to escape infection.
- Plant blight resistant varieties -

Potatoes: Losetto and Izzario are recommended by Gardening Which?) - and those having 'Sarpò' at the beginning of their name.

Tomatoes: Ferline, Legend and Fantasio show some resistance, but don't rely on it!

- Check if the weather favours infection and if outbreaks have occurred on the Blightline 02890 382372, or on www.blightwatch.co.uk
- There is no cure for blight, but you can apply copper based fungicides (eg Bordeaux Mixture) before blight is present - this deters but cannot cure and will need to be reapplied.

Raised Beds Project Completed

Although our 16 raised beds are now well into their successful second year of cultivation, works have continued to develop additional improvements largely thanks to a £10K grant from Awards for All (Big Lottery). These include installing an irrigation system, miscellaneous items such as a barrow and brooms, indoor and outdoor furniture, and most significantly a splendid shelter for our disabled gardeners and school parties. The shelter now contains the donated Sylvia Elkington Library of gardening books in memory of Sylvia who was such an enthusiastic plotholder and worker for our Society. Many thanks are due to Eric Hess for his expert advice and work on the irrigation system, to Louis Ingram and Roy Firth for their help painting the cabin inside and out, and particularly to Andrew Brown who has worked tirelessly for over four years to bring this Project to completion.

On 4 August, June Brookes cut the ribbon to officially open our log cabin intended as a shelter for raised bed users at Gordon Road Allotments.
